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Atopic Palmoplantar Eczema

Acute palmoplantar eczema (more popularly known as dyshidrotic eczema or pompholyx) is an intensely pruritic, vesicular eruption affecting the palms, soles, or both [1,2]. It is characterized by deep-seated lesions ranging from small vesicles to large tense bullae clinically and by spongiotic vesicles histologically.

Hyperkeratotic palmar dermatitis is a form of eczema in which there is thick scaling on the palms. Hyperkeratotic palmar dermatitis occurs without any obvious co-existing skin disease [1,2]. Hyperkeratotic palmar dermatitis is also known as hyperkeratotic hand eczema, hyperkeratotic eczema of the palms, and psoriasiform hand/palmar eczema.

What causes vesicular palmoplantar eczema?

Dyshidrotic dermatitis is a skin condition characterized by small, itchy blisters over the palms, fingers, or feet. These progress to scaly spots over the course of several weeks. Also known as dyshidrotic eczema, foot-and-hand eczema, and pompholyx, it can be associated with atopic dermatitis and seasonal allergies.

Hand eczema is characterized by a recurrent pruritic vesicular eruption of the palms, soles or digits. Because of the increased thickness of the keratin layer at these sites, the vesicles appear as small pale papules before rupturing (Figs 6.11, 6.12). Occasionally, frank bullae can form.

Hyperkeratotic hand eczema (HHE) is defined by sharply demarcated areas of hyperkeratosis or thick scaling on the palms, possibly extending to the

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palmar aspects of the fingers. 1, 2 There is little or no redness, and vesicles are absent. Plantar aspects of the feet can be involved as well.
