Benign childhood focal seizures are the most common and probably the most fascinating and rewarding topic in pediatric epileptology. They affect 25% of children with non-febrile seizures. Seizures are infrequent, usually nocturnal, and remit within 1 to 3 years from onset.

Different seizures include: jerking of the body (convulsions) repetitive movements unusual sensations such as a strange taste in the mouth or a strange smell, or a rising feeling in the stomach.

Childhood absence epilepsy (CAE) typically begins between 4 and 8 years of age. Absence seizures are the main seizure type. These are brief staring spells during which the child is not aware or responsive. Each seizure lasts about 10 to 20 seconds and ends abruptly. Without treatment, seizures typically occur many times a day.
